The new Mulberry Centre cancer facility at West Middlesex Hospital has been finished through the support of Carillion Building.

The Mulberry Centre is open to all those affected by the diagnosis of cancer, and is staffed on a purely voluntary basis. The centre comprises a Welcome Room and library in addition to the gardens, and offers counselling along with an information service. It also provides some complementary therapies such as t'ai chi, yoga, reflexology and aromatherapy.

One hundred and fifty people attended the official opening of the centre on the 12th June 2002, which included the unveiling of a 'Tree of Life' plaque bearing the names of all the companies who contributed to the project, including Carillion Building.

Supply Chain Manager Nigel Franklin was instrumental in arranging the donation of ideas and materials from suppliers and sub-contractors. Materials were provided for landscaping the garden, which will be used as a place of quiet retreat for cancer sufferers and their carers.

Human Resources helped arrange an information stand in the reception area for the opening ceremony.
