Over 20 staff were involved over the week in a sponsored ride between Building & Services contracts in the South East. An electronic quiz was also run which required respondents to research the sustainability pages on the intranet, with 1st prize being the newly donated bike that had been used on the ride.

A variety of mediums were used to educate and inform staff of the Carillion sustainability strategy and

suggest practical alternatives on living more sustainably. Emails were sent to all staff containing 'thoughts for the day' along with an invite to test-drive a dual fuel LPG Volvo that was available.
